SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The show is held under the Rules of the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy and is open to all. A copy of the Rules are obtainable from the G.C.C.F Office, 5 King's Castle Business Park, The Drove, Bridgwater, TA6 4AG. All exhibitors must obtain the GCCF Rules in full (Nov 2004 Edition) from the GCCF Office update sheets may be requested from the GCCF Office or down load the updates from the GCCF website (www.gccfcats.org) Exhibitors attention may then be drawn to specific rules. Ignorance of the Rules will not be accepted as an excuse for their breach.

REGISTRATION.

All Cats, Kittens and Neuters, except those entered in the Non-Pedigree Section, must be registered with the G.C.C.F. to be effective for entry, all registration and/or transfers must reach the G.C.C.F Office at least 21 days before the Show. No Cat or Kitten, entire or neutered, born after 19/10/71 with one or both parents, grandparents and great-grandparents unregistered, shall be eligible for the Open Classes. If the registration number has not been received when completing the Entry Form write N.A.F. (number applied for) in the appropriate column and forward number, when received to the Show Manager. Your first choice of name should be entered in the appropriate column of the Entry Form.

SHOW ENTRY:

Exhibitors must complete the official Entry Form and subscribe to the declaration therein. Every Exhibit must be identified on the Entry Form exactly as recorded on the registration/transfer certificate relating to it. Exhibitors are responsible for entering the correct classes, if an exhibit is owned by two persons, both must sign the Entry Form and both must be Members of the Clubs guaranteeing the Classes entered. **ONLY ENTRIES MADE ON THE THREE COUNTIES OFFICIAL ENTRY FORMS, WILL BE ACCEPTED.** No Cat, Kitten or Neuter from the same household may be entered in two Shows held within 13 days. Please do not omit to read and sign the declaration if joint owners, both must sign the Form.

VETERINARY:

Exhibits will be received at the entrance to the Show Hall from 09.30 to 10.45 a.m. on the morning of the Show. All exhibits must be brought to the Show in baskets or suitable containers and must be accompanied by the owner or owner's representative. **ALL CURRENT CERTIFICATES MUST BE AVAILABLE FOR VETERINARY INSPECTION.**

PLEASE NOTE: Homeopathic vaccination is not acceptable for the purpose of Showing. Each exhibit will be examined by the Society's Veterinary Surgeons who are authorised to exclude any exhibit they consider unfit, this includes exhibits showing skin lesions.

No exhibit may be penned before being examined. Exhibits must have clean ears and be free from pests. Pregnant or lactating queens may not compete. No exhibit that has been de-clawed will be admitted. Unfit exhibits must be removed by the owners and Entry Fees forfeited. If in the Veterinary Surgeon's opinion it is desirable, all other exhibits from the same cattery/household and the owner thereof, shall be debarred from attending the Show. The Veterinary Surgeon's

decision is final. When an exhibit has been rejected or withdrawn from the Show by a Veterinary Surgeon it shall not be re-presented to a second Veterinary Surgeon. The procedure to be adopted in such cases is clearly stated in the G.C.C.F. Rules.

VETERINARY CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE:

Exhibitors whose cats have been rejected please note the following points:-

1. When sending your clearance certificate to the G.C.C.F. Veterinary Officer, please include your copy of the rejection slip.
2. Please DO NOT send these certificates by recorded delivery post as this can cause considerable delays in the receipt of your certificates. If you wish to satisfy yourself that your letter has reached the Veterinary Officer please enclose a stamped addressed postcard for acknowledgment of receipt, and this will be signed and returned to you.
3. Exhibitors should not attend Shows until they have received a letter accepting and confirming clearance from the Veterinary Officer. It is recommended that this letter be taken to Shows within one month of issue. If an exhibit is unable to attend the Show for what ever reason, the Show Manager must be notified in writing. No fees will be returned after the official closing date of entries as published in the schedule.

EXHIBITS MUST BE INOCULATED AGAINST FELINE INFECTIOUS. ENTERITIS & CAT FLU. Sect 2,Rule 5c Amended with effect from 24/6/98 to bring in line with Sect 4, Rule 4f to read "All cats exhibited at Shows held under GCCF Rules must have a current vaccination certificate against FIE,FVR & FCV (Cat Flu) the full course in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations ,must have been completed more than seven days before the Show & should be available for inspection at vetting-in.

PRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS: Exhibitors must provide each exhibit with a **CLEAN WHITE BLANKET**, a white sanitary tray and a drinking bowl with water. None of this equipment must bear any distinguishing marks, blankets must be plain woven. Cellular blankets are not allowed but white vet-bed or like material with white or green backing may be used if preferred. Judges are instructed to pass any pen that is distinguished in any manner. Food containers must be removed from the pen when judging commences at 11.00am and must not be returned until 1.00pm.or until the Open Class has been judged. Vetting-in slips and exhibitor's passes will be handed to exhibitors at vetting-in (Show day) No written or printed matter of any kind other than official notices and award cards may be put on competitive pens. Exhibits received into the Show hall must not be removed without the sanction of the Show Manager/s. They are received only on condition that the Club shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits baskets or other property.

The Show closes at 5.00pm and no exhibit may be removed from its pen before this time.

EXHIBITORS: Any exhibitor in any way interfering with or removing any exhibit from its pen during the Show except with the consent of the Show Manager, will forfeit any award which may be due to his/her exhibit. No one may remove any exhibit from its pen except the owner or Show Official. All exhibitors are forbidden to carry their exhibits

around the Hall and they must not be held in such a way as to annoy other exhibits. Also no one may take photographs of any Exhibit/s at this Show without first getting permission from the Show Manager/s and then getting permission from the cat/s owner/s. **ANYONE CONTRAVENING THIS ORDER WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE HALL & THEIR CAT/S WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

JUDGES: Judges are empowered to withhold any prize or Challenge Certificate in any Class if the exhibit/s do not, in their opinion, possess sufficient merit. Prizes will be awarded from the Judge's slips. In an emergency, Judges may be changed during the course of the Show, with the consent of the Show Manager/s. Rule 18, Sect 4, of the Rules of the GCCF. Exhibitors are reminded that the decision of the Judge's are final. Any attempt to influence such decisions will render the offender's liable to disciplinary Action (Amended 1/6/84).

COUNTERSIGNATURES: In the event of a change of Judge of an Open Class Occurring after the closing date of the Show, and provided that the exhibitor informs the Show Manager/s prior to Judging, that a certificate has previously been awarded by the replacement Judge, the Show Manager/s shall appoint one other Judge who shall judge the cat and if the cat is considered worthy, countersign the certificate which shall then count towards Championship status. Note 3:(added 1/6/98) If the replacement Judge at the first Show has also been previously booked for a subsequent Show, the closing date of which is before the date of the first Show then at the subsequent Show this Judge can be considered as a replacement Judge for the purpose of requesting a countersignature.

THE COMMITTEE RESERVE TO THEMSELVES THE RIGHT TO:

- (a) Appoint other Judges should those advertised be unable to fulfil their engagements and to appoint further Judges if deemed necessary.
- (b) Fix, and limit the number of exhibits at the Show and refuse entry without giving a reason.
- (c) Cancel, amalgamate or divide Classes.
- (d) Publish a catalogue of the Show containing information as to the exhibits and the names and addresses of exhibitors.
- (e) Exhibitors will be charged any fees the Society may incur due to their cheques being returned by their bank marked 'Refer to Drawer' ie NOT HONOURED BY THE BANK currently £10-20.

ADVICE TO EXHIBITORS AS FROM 1/6/92.:

- (a) You are advised against purchasing any shampoo's that change a cat/s coat colour as this can lead to disqualification.
- (b) Homeopathic Vaccinations are not acceptable to the GCCF for the purpose of vetting-in
- (c) Any alterations to your Entry Form must be in writing which will be attached to the form by the Show Manager/s. You may also make corrections to the form up to the close of the Show.
- (d) Kittens under the age of fourteen (14) weeks may not be shown.
- (e) Any person whose cat's have been rejected under Section C or D must not

officiate as a Judge or Steward or in any other capacity which requires the handling of cats at Shows until a clearance certificate as required by the GCCF. Has been obtained.

- (f) The use of small battery driven fans in pens can be dangerous, and could also be considered a distinguishing mark.
- (g) Please note that in addition to the Classes you have entered, your cat may also be handled for the purpose of assessing candidates in the GCCF appointment scheme.
- (h) Queens who have kitted within 12 weeks of the date of the Show may not be shown

CORRESPONDENCE: All correspondence must be accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope if a reply is required. Any complaint relating to the Show must be forwarded in writing to the Show Manager/s within seven (7) days of the Show. To prevent disappointment it is recommended that exhibitors enclose a stamped addressed unsealed envelope with their entries, to be returned as acknowledgement of receipt of Entries.(this enables the Show Manager/s to Manager/s to reply if any queries arise)**NOTICE OF CHANGE:** An announcement on "GCCF Site" of any alterations or additions made to the Schedule or in these regulations shall be sufficient notice thereof. (providing time permits).

DEFINITION OF CLASSES:

BREED/OPEN CLASS: Open to all of the specified breed.(Must be GCCF Registered)

CATS: Not less than 9 Calendar Months on the day of the Show.

KITTENS: Not less than 14 calendar weeks and under 9 calendar months on the day of the Show. Since 1st June 2001 Neuter Kittens are be entered in Kitten Open & Miscellaneous Classes and will compete for BIS Kitten. Neuter Kittens of preliminary Breeds should be included in Kitten Assessment Classes where separate Classes for Adult, Kitten and Neuter are scheduled

NEUTER ADULTS: Neuter Adults may only enter Neuter Classes and may not compete with entire cats or kittens .except in Club Classes which are scheduled to include Neuters. Where Best In Show is held, the Best Neuter shall be considered against the Best Entire Adult and Kitten for Best Exhibit In Show.

NOVICE: Exhibits that have not won a First Prize in any class at a Show held under G.C.C.F. Rules.

LIMIT: Exhibits that have not won more than Four first Prizes in any Class at a Show held under GCCF Rules.

DEBUTANTE: Exhibits that have never been shown at a Show held under GCCF Rules (If Debutante Adult & Neuter Classes are offered at a Show Debutante entry as a kitten does not count when the exhibit is shown as an Adult or Neuter & Debutante as an Adult does not count when the exhibit is Neutered & shown)

MAIDEN: Exhibits that have not won a First, Second or Third Prize in any Class at a

- BREEDERS:** Show held under GCCF Rules. Exhibits bred by exhibitor/s. Cats originally registered in the Breeder's joint ownership but changed to single ownership of one of the Breeders can still be entered in this Class. Cats originally registered in Breeder's single ownership and changed to joint ownership with the Breeder should be entered in the Non-Breeders Class.
- ADOLESCENT:** Cats over 9 Calendar Months of age and up to 15 Months old on the day of the Show.
- JUNIOR:** Cats over 9 Calendar months of age and under 2 years on the day of the Show.
- SENIOR:** Cats 2 years old and over on the day of the Show.
- RADIUS:** For Cats and Kittens living under 25 miles from the Show Hall.
- VISITORS:** For Cats and Kittens living over 25 miles from the Show Hall.
- ARISTOCRAT:** Exhibits with 1 or 2 Challenge or Premier Certificates.
- ASSESSMENT:** For Experimental Breeds only entrants may also enter the appropriate Miscellaneous and Club Classes. Entries must include a Standard of Points which have been approved by the GCCF.
- The status of the Exhibit for entering restricted Classes (ie, Maiden Limit, etc) shall be the cat's status on the day of entry, except where Section 2, Rule 15e regarding entry into the Grand Classes applies. The wins as a Kitten do not count when the exhibit is shown as an Adult or Neuter, the wins as an Adult do not count when the exhibit is neutered & shown. Merit awards do not count as 'wins' for entering restricted Classes.

CHAMPIONS AND PREMIERS.

The title of Champion for Cats and Premier for Neuters shall be granted to exhibits winning Three Challenge Certificates or Premier Certificates at three Shows under separate Judges. A GCCF Challenge Premier Certificate will be offered for each Cat/Neuter Open Class of the recognised Breeds with Championship Status.

GRAND CHAMPIONS/ GRAND PREMIERS.

The title of Grand Champion will be granted to a Cat winning three Grand Challenge Certificates at three Shows under three different Judges. Only one prize with a Reserve in case of disqualification will be awarded. The title of Grand Premier shall be granted to Neutered Cats under the same Rules and conditions as those for Grand Champions.

IMPERIAL GRAND CHAMPION & IMPERIAL GRAND PREMIER

The Titles of Imperial Grand Champion & Imperial Grand Premier shall be attained by the awarding of FIVE Imperial Grand Challenge/Imperial Grand Premier Certificates as appropriate by five different Judges at shows licensed by the GCCF. No cat shall be eligible to enter the Imperial Grand Champion/ Imperial Grand Premier Classes unless it has attained the Status of Grand Champion/Grand Premier as the case may be, on or before the Closing date for Entries, published in the Schedule

A cat will still be eligible for Best Of Breed if not entered in the relevant Breed Open following three classes class. The categories for these certificates are: Persian (Self & Non Self combined), British, Foreign (Original & AOV Foreign combined) Burmese, Oriental & Siamese (combined) Only One Prize with a Reserve in case of disqualification will be awarded,

per section classes will be split Male & Female.

OLYMPIAN CHAMPION/PREMIERS

The title of Olympian Imperial Grand Champion/Premier will be granted to a cat winning Five Olympian Imperial Grand Certificates at Five Shows under Five different Judges. Only One prize with a Reserve in case of disqualification will be awarded.

A cat will still be eligible for Best Of Breed if not entered in the relevant Breed class.

ENTRY FEES AND PRIZES:

Entry Fees, include Benching : Open/Breed Class and up to TWO other Classes.

Pedigree Entry Fees: Members: £26.00. Non-Members: £28.00.

Non-Pedigree Entry Fees: Members: £19.00. Non-Members: £21.00.

All Additional Classes: £3.00.

Exhibition Pens: £15.00.

Admission: Adults: £2.00/Child/Senior Citizen: £1.00.

Catalogues with Entry Form: £2.00. £3.00 on Show Day.

Entry Fees include One Entry Pass per form Admission to the Hall for others Please Pay For your Tickets with Entry Form. All admission passes to be shown before entering the Hall

GENERAL GUIDELINES ON ENTERING SHOWS.

Exhibitors can obtain details on entering Shows on the GCCF website

Where possible, always complete your Show Entry Form from your GCCF registration

document (ie,Registration or Transfer Certificate) for the cat that is being exhibited,

PRINTING the details carefully to avoid misinterpretation of your handwriting. If you

have not received your Registration document at the time of Entry,complete the Show

Entry Form with the details from the Pedigree giving the first choice of name if it is a

non-prefix registration and put RAF (Registration Applied For) or TAF (Transfer Applied

For) or both, in the Reg'd-No box. It is wise to enclose a Stamped self-addressed

acknowledgement postcard with all registration and transfer applications particularly fo

cats entered for Shows,so that you know that the application has been received by the

GCCF Office. Try to keep a copy of your Entry Form, then when you receive registration details and number, check these against the Entry Form and notify the Show Manager/s in writing of any differences in the details as well as giving the registration number, if applicable. This may not be in time for the printing of the Show Catalogue but your letter will then be attached to your Entry Form, which will save unnecessary notification of discrepancies when the Show is checked. All Catalogue errors are checked against the original Entry Form and any exhibitor's letters are used for reference. Show Managers are permitted to accept corrections, at their own discretion up to the close of the Show (on Show Day), such a change must not be a change of exhibit. If you are entering several cats from your household and the registered owners (exhibitors) differ within that family/household, check with the Show Manager whether using one Entry Form is acceptable or not, if it is indicate VERY CLEARLY which exhibitor owns which cat, ensuring all owners sign the declaration on the Entry Form. It maybe less confusing and more acceptable to the Show Manager for each owner within the one family to use separate Entry Forms but joint owners should always use the same form and BOTH MUST SIGN the declaration.

STATUS OF ERRORS WHAT TO EXPECT.

MINOR ERRORS:

These warrant a notification for your reference if the error occurs more than once and it is apparent that registration details were available at the time of Entry or before the date of the Show. Continuous repetition of the same error after notification will be referred to the Executive Committee.

Examples of minor errors include:

- (a) Spelling errors.
- (b) Separation of cat's names that should be one word, and vice versa.
- (c) Administrative breeder's prefix omitted from, or partially incorrect name given for exhibit (revised 12.1.95)
- (d) Overseas Title preceding the name of an exhibit, sire or dam, etc.
- (e) Full breed number known but not given.
- (f) Sire & Dam reversed (revised 5.1.94) or named incorrectly (revised 12.1.95)
- (g) Breeder joint when single and vice versa (revised 5.1.94)

Incorrect Date of Birth: This is usually classed as a minor error unless it affects an entry into Classes based on age groups, when it could warrant disqualification of the exhibit from such Classes, but if the incorrect date of birth affects the age suitability as a whole, then the exhibit will be disqualified from the Show.

N.B. AGE LIMITS:

Kittens - Not less than 14 calendar weeks and under 9 calendar months on date of Show with effect from 1.6.94.

Adults - Not less than 9 calendar months on date of Show.

Incorrect Name of Exhibit/Owner/Sire/Dam or Breeder.

If registration was obviously available at the time of entry or before the date of

the Show, disqualification is inevitable. The following discrepancies are those which usually arise:

EXHIBIT/SIRE/DAM - Omission of Administrative or Breeder's Prefix.

- Incomplete name/unregistered name added.
- Sire and Dam reversed.
- Totally incorrect name or names.

REGISTERED OWNER - Joint when they should be single and vice versa.

EXHIBITOR/BREEDER - Totally incorrect Name or Names.

Please note: (1) The Exhibitor/s must be the registered owner/s of the cat and NOT necessarily the person who actually takes the cat to the Show.

(2) The Breeder of a cat is ALWAYS the registered owner of the Dam on the date of the cat's birth.

REGISTRATION/TRANSFER: Not received by GCCF 21 days before the date of the Show. These entries will be disqualified. Remember, the effective date of registrations and transfers is the first date of valid receipt by the GCCF and if you enclose your own stamped addressed acknowledgement card with your application form, this will be stamped with the GCCF Office date of receipt. Transfer of exhibit from exhibitor to a New Owner received more than 21 days before the date of the Show. Entries such as these will also be disqualified as the exhibitor's Entry Form becomes invalid.

Incorrect Class Entry:

These will be disqualified from the Class concerned, so always check with the Show Manager/s if in doubt about which Class to enter. If a breed number is changed officially, it is important that you notify the Show Manager/s immediately.

Cat Registered On the Reference Register:

No cat registered on this Register is eligible to be shown and therefore these entries will be disqualified. The only exception to this is when a new breed becomes recognised and then, cats of the breed may be shown even if they are registered on the Reference Register as long as this was the only reason for the Reference Register. Exhibitors may appeal against any disqualifications resulting from Show checking, giving their reasons and/or explanations which are referred to the Executive Committee if considered valid. If not a further explanation will be given. However the above advice is aimed to keep your Show Entries trouble free, not to mention the Show checking.

NEW RULE ON BITING AT SHOWS (effective 1.6.88)

Any Cat biting or inflicting injury by deliberately scratching a Judge, Veterinary Surgeon, Steward or other Show Official must be reported to the Show Manager/s. The Show Manager/s must withdraw the cat from the Show and shall inform the owner of the cat in writing, sending a copy to the Secretary of the GCCF. If the cat was defending itself in exceptional and frightening circumstances, that information should be given to the Secretary of the GCCF for consideration by the Executive Committee. If the cat is reported at another subsequent Show, it shall be disqualified from all future Shows unless the Executive Committee rule otherwise.

ADVERTISEMENTS: May we remind Exhibitors that they should not advertise the future attendance of their cat/s at any GCCF Shows as this could lead to disciplinary action under Section 4 Rule 18. and great care should be taken when advertising in Magazines, Newspapers, Newsletters or on the Internet.

PLEASE NOTE.

All Adult, Kitten & Neuter OPEN CLASSES will be Split Male & Female where both sexes are entered.

**PLEASE NOTE WHEN FILLING IN YOUR ENTRY FORM:
YOU MUST ALWAYS PUT IN THE OPEN CLASS BOX THE CORRECT
OPEN CLASS FOR YOUR CAT.**

If your cat is entered in a Grand or an Imperial Class and you wish it to be judged for 'BOB Only' then put an 'X' in the box marked 'BOB Only'

If your cat is not entered in a Grand or an Imperial Class the 'BOB Only' box DOES NOT APPLY TO YOU.

**ALL BOB WINNERS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR BEST IN SHOW
Best Cat, Kitten & Neuter from each section will finally be
Judged for BIS.**

Best White Persian, Best Self Exhibit, Best Non-Self Exhibit.

**NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS/VISITORS:
IF FOR ANY REASON THE SHOW MANAGERS
ask you to leave the Hall you must leave by the nearest
exit leaving your **cats and baggage** in the hall & not
return until advised to do so.
(This is a Ruling By Public Law Not just the GCCF)**

OLYMPIAN CLASSES

These are open to all Breeds of pedigree Cat/Neuter that have been Awarded the Title of 'Gr Ch or Imperial Gr Pr.

- OLY 1 Olympian Class – any Imperial Gr Ch Adult Male.....Mrs J Ashman
- OLY 2 Olympian Class – any Imperial Gr Ch Adult Female..... Mrs J Ashman
- OLY 3 Olympian Class – any Imperial Gr Pr Neuter Male..... Mr M Pearman
