## **BRITISH NEUTERS**

### **BROWN SPOTTED NEUTER FEMALE.**

BOB. ABSALOM'S IGR. CH. & GR. PR. Wellmar Balti BR1n 24. FN. 16.5.09.

A mature Brown Spotted lady of over 6yr. showing good British type. Round head with good breadth and depth; medium size ears which are a little open at the base; cheeks rounded to behind the muzzle; firm chin, level bite, short broad nose; round eyes of copper just beginning to lose the depth of colour. Large cobby body; broad chest; short well-boned legs; firm round paws; tail a little out of balance to her large body size! Coat short, dense, and firm; clear black spots to a golden ground colour; spots broken on sides of body, just beginning to merge on spine line; well ringed tail. A friendly girl who handled well and who was shown in very good condition

### **BLACK SILVER SPOTTED NEUTER MALE.**

BOB. LITTLEWOOD'S PR. GOSPRITELY SILVER TAFFETA BR1ns 24. MN. 30.11.12.

This Black Silver Spotted boy of nearly 3yr. shows good British type. He was a little nervous at first, but soon recovered.

Good round head; ears standing a little tall; well-rounded cheeks to firm chin; level bite; short broad nose; very good shade of green to his round eyes. His cobby body is of good weight; broad chest; short well-boned legs; balanced tail.

Coat is a little soft in texture, with good contrast of black spots to silver ground colour; spots slightly elongated on spine line, well defined on the sides of his body; spots on abdomen and paws; well-ringed tail. I think he felt the cold in the hall, so my steward put his blanket over him, which I think he appreciated!

## **BEST OF VARIETY SEMI-LONGHAIED.**

### SEMI-LONGHAIRD KITTEN.

BOV. BEST & MATTHEWS' TASSARE THOMAS. MCO n 22 M. 26.3.15.

A balanced and well-grown Brown Tabby boy of 6 months showing good Maine Coon type, with a very alert expression.

A well-grown large body with excellent boning to his legs and paws. A clear brown tabby pattern to his excellent coat. This boy truly had the "'X' Factor" for me! Congratulations to his owners as I believe he was overall Best Semi Longhair Exhibit.
