The highlight was joining Diana & Kay on the centre stage judging for overall Supreme HHP, being, Sup.UK OGIGMC QT for Non-Pedigree Pet; Cream Cookie Kitten & Pedigree Pet OGIGMC Barney Rubble all a credit to their owners.

Class 1112a – AC SH UK & IGMC (for BOB only)

1 male & two females entered.
