SHARED VENUE

The Show venue is shared between:

The Balinese Cat Society Championship Show – for all colours of Balinese.

The Caramel and Apricot Federation Championship Show – for all Siamese, Balinese and Orientals.

The Tabby Pointed Siamese Cat Society Championship Show – for all Siamese, Balinese and Orientals.

All shows also include a Non-Pedigree Section.

You may enter any of the three shows at the Members rate if you are a member of one of the three clubs.

You may enter any eligible exhibit in **TWO** of the shows (**but no more than two**). Exhibits entered in two shows may not be entered in more than 4 classes per show (consideration for Best of Breed only for titled cats does not count as a class entered).

The Overall Best Pedigree Exhibits in each of the three shows will be judged against each other for “Best of the Best” as will the Best Household Pets. A special rosette will be awarded to each. The judge selecting “Best of the Best” for both Pedigree and Household Pet exhibits will be Mrs D Brown.

Special prizes will be gratefully received. They may be placed directly on the pens to which they have been awarded by the donor. They will be acknowledged in the show catalogue provided that the Show Manager is notified of them by the closing date for entries.

Looking forward to welcoming you to our **new venue**, plenty of parking and disabled access. Walking distance to Bracknell shopping centre and local amenities. There will be cafeteria facilities on site for breakfasts and lunches as well as a variety of stalls selling cat orientated items.

EMS breed Codes

In all paperwork produced for shows, cats' breeds will now be described by EMS codes rather than old GCCF breed numbers. This does not mean that you need to enter the EMS code on your entry form. It is as ever recommended that you take the registration details from your registration or transfer certificate - if that includes an EMS code, then you should certainly use it. Alternatively, if you can use the GCCF online services to look up the details for your cat, then you can use the EMS code you will find there. But failing either of these, please use the GCCF breed number as on your registration or transfer certificate - do not try to translate it into an EMS code.

Whatever you use it may be translated to an EMS code in any acknowledgement of your entry which is sent (and will be translated in the catalogue, judges' books and the like).

Online Show entry is available for all 3 shows.

You may enter any of the shows online. Payment may be made either by sending a cheque to the show manager, or by direct BACS transfer to the appropriate club account. Details will be given to you in the course of the online entry.

You will be able to find the address to use for online show entry from any of the clubs' show pages in their own web-sites, and also on the GCCF web site.

(you will also be able to download the schedule and both entry forms from all these places)

Rule Changes

You must now clip your cat's claws, and will be rejected at vetting-in if this has not been done (though you will be given the opportunity clip them and present the cat again).

A certificate will be awarded to the winner of overall Best in Show (both pedigree and Household Pet) provided this is not a kitten. The certificate will be at the level the cat qualifies for earlier in the show – so for example for a cat awarded its third qualifying ordinary certificate, the award will be a Grand. The certificate will not be available on the day, but will be sent from the GCCF office once show checking has been performed.

The catalogue will no longer contain details of exhibitor's addresses, but they must still be provided on the entry form.

SHOW RULES, PROCEDURES AND REGULATIONS

This show is licensed by the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy and is open to all.

Exhibitors must ensure that they have a current copy of the GCCF Rules. Section 4 gives you the information you need to know, as an exhibitor, about eligibility, presentation, countersignatures etc.

Please make sure that you read and understand the Rules and this schedule before entering the show. Ignorance of the Rules will not be accepted as an excuse for their breach. Many have NOT been repeated in full in this schedule.

ELIGIBILITY

Balinese Adults, Kittens and Neuters are eligible for this Show if registered with the GCCF. All registered Pedigree cats and Non-Pedigree cats are eligible for exhibition.

All registrations and/or transfers must have reached the GCCF Office at least 10 days before the date of the show or the exhibit will be DISQUALIFIED. If you have entered the exhibit in your name and it is transferred away from you before this date it will also be DISQUALIFIED because the entry form becomes invalid. If you have not yet got the registration number when you enter, write RAF (registration applied for) instead, fill in the name you have applied for, and send/email the number and any change of name to the Show Manager when they arrive.

If you change the registered COLOUR of your exhibit before show day, please inform the Show Manager as soon as possible. There is no "10 day limit" on this.

Unregistered cats from unregistered or unknown parents, of traditional "moggie" appearance, may enter Non-Pedigree classes in the Household Pet Section. Cats of known full or half pedigree background, registered or unregistered, or cats of pedigree appearance but of unknown background may enter Non-Pedigree classes in the Household Pet Section. All Household Pets over six months of age must be neutered.

SHOW ENTRY FORM

Please read the entry form and the GCCF Rules relating to entry thoroughly before completing the form. If you are entering a cat in single ownership and one in joint ownership, please use separate forms. If you are entering a cat on exhibition the show entry form must be completed exactly as for competition entries, marking E1 in the Classes box.

Exhibits entered incorrectly will be disqualified from the class concerned or from the show, depending on the error. Entry fees will not be refunded.

Please check your entry very carefully to make sure that it is clear and legible, that you have entered your cat in the correct classes, that you have signed the form and that you have sent the correct money. Any entries which are incorrect will be returned and the resulting delay could mean that you are too late to enter. We will NOT allow you to sign the form or pay the balance of the money on Show day. If you find errors in your catalogue entry these may be corrected on Show day.

CORRESPONDENCE

All correspondence must be accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope if a reply is required. Any complaints relating to the Show must be forwarded, in writing, to the Show Manager within seven days of the Show.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing. No withdrawals can be accepted after the published closing date of the show or any extended closing date published on the GCCF website. If your cat is ill and you enclose a veterinary certificate we may be able to refund some of your entry fees, at the discretion of the Show Committee, depending on when notification is received and how much work has already been done with regard to your entry.

PRE-SHOW PREPARATION

Read the rules carefully. A current vaccination means that the initial course or last booster must have been completed not less than one week and not more than one year plus one week before show day. "Homeopathic vaccination" is not acceptable. The vaccination certificate must be completed properly with the name and address of the owner and the full identity of the cat.

Please make sure that your exhibit is clean and healthy before arriving at the show. Please check your cat's claws and, if necessary, trim them before the show.

If you have to bath your cat please be very careful which shampoo you use. Many shampoos sold for cats contain colouring matter and if you use one of these your cat could be disqualified.

The use of any products, including skullcap & valerian, rescue remedy, sedatives for travel etc, which change a cat's appearance or physical reaction is forbidden and will lead to disqualification.

ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW

Exhibits will be received at the entrance to the Show Hall from 8 until 9.30 on the morning of the show. All exhibits must be brought to the show in suitable secure containers (top-opening recommended) and must be accompanied by their owners or representatives who must remain within call throughout the period of the Show except when the hall is cleared for judging. Exhibits will only be accepted on condition that the Clubs shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits, containers or property in any way.

If your cat cannot be removed from the container safely it will not be vetted in. (see Rules)

All exhibits must be examined before entering the Show Hall. (see rules regarding rejection and Notes on Rejection at end of Section 4)

Any exhibit which, in the opinion of the Duty Veterinary Surgeon, is in poor condition or undersized for its age will be rejected. If the exhibit is below an acceptable size for a 14 week kitten it **MUST BE TAKEN HOME**. If necessary, in order to achieve this, all exhibits from that household will be excluded and all entry fees forfeited. If you are in any doubt about the size or condition of your exhibit, please leave it at home.

Rejected exhibits must be removed by their owners and entry fees forfeited. Owners of rejected exhibits, together with their other exhibits, may also be debarred from entering the Show Hall. The Duty Veterinary Surgeon's decision is final

OWNERS' LIABILITY FOR VETERINARY TREATMENT AT SHOWS

Exhibitors (owners) are responsible for the cost of any veterinary treatment required by their cat(s) in their absence from the show hall.

CLEARANCE

If your cat is rejected from a show please note the following points:

1. When sending your clearance certificate to the GCCF Office please include your copy of the rejection form.
2. Please do not send these certificates by special delivery post. If you wish to be sure they have arrived enclose a stamped addressed postcard to be signed and returned to you.
3. Exhibitors should not attend shows until they have received a letter from the Office accepting and confirming clearance. Take this letter with you to any shows you attend **within one month of its issue.**

PRESENTATION

Please read the Rules regarding pen equipment and penning your cat. Take pride in presenting your exhibit. Be sure that it is comfortable, warm and relaxed. White equipment will be on sale at the show. You may use the litter used at home - this need not be white. Sewn cat beds or "nests" may be used if desired.

Exhibition pens are designed to form a display and may be decorated in any way you wish, but please make sure that there is ample room for the cat to be comfortable.

Vetting-in envelopes and exhibitors passes will be handed to you at vetting-in. Please check your pen number carefully and make sure you pen your cat correctly.

PLEASE NOTE

Please do not handle your cat or hover near your pen if a judge approaches to judge your cat. Indicating the ownership of the cat could lead to disqualification.

Nobody may remove an exhibit from its pen except the owner, owner's agent or Show official. Exhibitors must not carry their exhibits round the show hall. Exhibits must not be held in such a way as to annoy other exhibits. Any person in any way interfering with or removing any exhibit from its pen during the Show, except with the permission of the Show Manager, will forfeit any award that may be due.

Exhibits actually received into the Show Hall cannot be removed without the permission of the Show Manager. The Show closes at 5.00 pm and no exhibit may be removed from its pen before this time. Anyone breaking this rule could be subject to disciplinary action.

Judges are empowered to withhold any award in any class if the exhibits do not, in the Judge's opinion, possess sufficient merit.

WARNING

Exhibits, including those on exhibition, may not be sold at the show.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

In order to qualify for the reduced Show entry fee for Members you must be a fully paid-up Member of the BCS, C&AF, or TPSCS at the time of entry.

If you enter as a Member please indicate the Club of which you are a member.

An application form for membership of the BCS is included in this schedule. If you are not already a member and wish to join, please send the completed application form with your entry form, and include the entry fee in your payment.

THE COMMITTEE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO

1. Appoint other judges should those advertised be unable to fulfil their engagements and to appoint further judges should they be required.
2. Accept or refuse entries without giving reasons.
3. Cancel, amalgamate or divide classes.
4. Publish a catalogue of the Show containing information as to the exhibits and the names of exhibitors, and process such information by computer.
5. Retain a percentage of the entry fees to cover essential expenses in the event of the show being cancelled for any reason.

An announcement on the GCCF website of any alterations or additions made to the schedule or regulations shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.

SPONSORSHIP

A sponsorship form is included at the back of the schedule.

COUNTERSIGNATURES

Please read the Rule about Countersignatures thoroughly. If your cat may need a Countersignature you must tell the Show Manager before judging starts.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

BREED CLASS	Open to untitled cats of the specified breed (must be GCCF Registered)
GRAND CLASS	Open to Champion/Premier titled cats
IMPERIAL GRAND CLASS	Open to Grand Champion/Grand Premier titled cats
OLYMPIAN CLASS	Open to full Imperial Grand Champion/Imperial Grand Premier titled cats
(The above classes are collectively referred to as OPEN classes)	
ADULTS	9 months old and over on Show day.
KITTENS	14 weeks – 9 months old on Show day.
NEUTERED KITTENS	Should enter Open Kitten classes and suitable miscellaneous and club classes for kittens.
NEUTERS	Neutered adults, male or female, may only enter classes specified for neuters.
BREEDERS	For exhibits bred by the exhibitor(s). Cats originally registered in the Breeders' joint ownership but changed to single ownership of one of the Breeders can still be entered in this class. Cats originally registered in the Breeder's single ownership and changed to joint ownership with the Breeder should be entered in the Non-Breeders class.
NOVICE	Exhibit that has not won a 1st prize in any class at a GCCF Show.
MAIDEN	Exhibit that has not won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize in any class at a GCCF Show.
LIMIT	Exhibit that has not won more than four 1st prizes in any class at a GCCF Show.
DEBUTANTE	Exhibit that has not been shown before under GCCF Rules.
ADOLESCENT	9 – 15 months old on Show day.
JUNIOR	9 months – 2 years old on Show day.
SENIOR	2 years old and over on Show day.
VETERAN	7 years old and over on Show day.

The status of the exhibit for entering restricted classes (Novice etc.) shall be its status on the day of entry, except where rules 11a and 11b, section 4 of the GCCF Rules apply. Wins as kittens do not count when entering adult classes. Wins as entire adults or kittens do not count when entering neuter classes. Merits do not count as first prizes when entering restricted classes (Novice etc.)

ENTRY FEES

Entry fees include up to 4 classes. There is one free admission ticket whether for single or joint exhibitors; exhibitors entering more than one show still receive only one free ticket.

DEFINITION OF THE BALINESE

A Balinese is a longhaired Oriental type cat, developed solely from Balinese and Siamese (genotype) breeding. The coat is long, fine and silky and flows mainly flat along the body due to the absence of undercoat. The bone structure, coat colour and pattern is that retained from its Siamese breeding, which is strong, as Pedigrees may only contain Balinese, Siamese and the intermediate generation, referred to as the Balinese Variant. It follows naturally that no Balinese conforming to the above definition can have less than three generations of acceptable breeding in its immediate background.

HOUSEHOLD PET (Pedigree & Non-pedigree) EXHIBITORS – If your cat has won a Master, Grand Master, Imperial Grand Master, Olympian Master or UK Grand Master title at a GCCF Show, please make your claim to the GCCF Office address above. Please include the information below with your photocopies of the relevant certificates. All claims are acknowledged and, periodically, a list of Master title winners will be published on the web site, shortly after which medals that have been paid for will be sent to the owners.

MASTER TITLE

The title Master (M) shall be attained by the awarding of three Master certificates by three different judges at participating GCCF Championship shows.

GRAND MASTER TITLE

The title Grand Master (GM) shall be attained by the awarding of three Grand Master certificates by three different judges at participating GCCF Championship Shows.

IMPERIAL GRAND MASTER TITLE

The title Imperial Grand Master (IGM) shall be attained by the awarding of five Imperial Grand Master certificates by five different judges at participating GCCF Championship Shows.

OLYMPIAN MASTER TITLE

The Olympian title shall be attained by the awarding of five Olympian certificates by 5 different judges at participating Championship or Sanction GCCF shows. Only one certificate is allowed at one breed show at each level. The first five awards will be noted with the title Olympian Bronze, the 2nd five will be noted with the title of Olympian Silver and the 3rd five will be noted with the title of Olympian Gold (total fifteen certificates to reach Olympian Gold).

MEDALS COST £16.50 per medal including 1 free bar (excluding Olympian bars), £8 per subsequent bar. Olympian bars (Bronze, Silver or Gold) are £10, if a medal is required with the Olympian bar then the fee is £26.50. UK Medals are £20. Payment with orders please.
