GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ENTERING SHOWS

Full details of exhibiting at GCCF Shows are given in the GCCF Rules Section 4, available on the GCCF website under “About GCCF” and “Forms and Downloads” at www.gccfcats.org or can be purchased for a small charge post free by telephoning the GCCF Office. The following provides some additional explanation.

Where possible, always complete your show entry form using details from your GCCF Registration Certificate for the cat that is to be exhibited. Please **print** the details carefully to avoid any misinterpretation of your handwriting. If the Registration Certificate you have does not show your name and address this means that the cat is not registered in your name and you must transfer the cat into your name no later than ****10 days** before the show. Transfer can be done instantly using GCCF “**Online Services**” at www.gccfcats.org.

If you have not received your Registration Certificate at the time of entry, complete the show entry form with the details from the pedigree, giving the first choice of name if it is a non-prefix registration, and put RAF (Registration Applied For) or TAF (Transfer Applied For), or both, in the Regd. No. box. It is wise to enclose a stamped self-addressed acknowledgement postcard with all registration and transfer applications, particularly for cats entered for shows, so that you know that the application has been received by the GCCF.

It is recommended that you keep a copy of your entry form – then, when you receive registration details and number, check these against the entry form and notify the Show Manager in writing of any differences in the details as well as giving the registration number, if applicable. This may not be in time for the printing of the show catalogue, but the Show Manager should attach your letter to your entry form which will save unnecessary notification of discrepancies when that show is checked. All catalogue errors are checked against the original entry form and any exhibitors’ letters are used for reference. Show managements are permitted to accept corrections, at their own discretion, up to the close of the show (on show day). Any such correction must not be an addition or substitution of any exhibit for which proof of entry cannot be validated, or a change of exhibitor/owner.

If you are entering several cats from your household and the registered owners (exhibitors) differ within that household/family, check with the Show Manager whether using one entry form is acceptable or not and, if it is, indicate **very clearly** which exhibitor owns which cat, ensuring all owners sign the entry form. It may be less confusing and more acceptable to the Show Manager for each owner to use separate entry form, but joint owners of an exhibit should always use the same form and ****at least one of the owners has signed the declaration.**

Exhibitors are reminded that the decisions of the judges are final. Any attempt to influence such decisions, or to identify a cat or ownership of a cat to a judge at a show before that judge’s engagement has been completed, may render the offender liable to disciplinary action.

IF THERE IS A MISTAKE ON YOUR ENTRY– WHAT TO EXPECT

Minor Errors

Should a small error be made these will be resolved between Exhibitor, Show manager and/or GCCF. Persistent repetition may result in further action being taken.

Incorrect Date of Birth

This is usually classed as a minor error unless it affects an entry into classes based on age groups, when it could warrant disqualification of the exhibit from such classes; but if the incorrect date of birth affects the age suitability as a whole, then the exhibit will be disqualified from the show.

N.B. AGE LIMITS: Kittens – not less than 14 weeks and under 9 calendar months on date of show
Adults – not less than 9 calendar months on date of show

Incorrect Name of Exhibit/Owner

If registration/transfer details were obviously available at the time of entry or before the date of the show, disqualification is inevitable. The following discrepancies are those which usually arise:

EXHIBIT Totally incorrect name

OWNER/EXHIBITOR Declaration not signed by **at least one of the** registered owner(s)
N.B. The exhibitor(s) must be the registered owner(s) of the cat and **not** necessarily the person who actually takes the cat to the show.

Registration/Transfer Not Received by the GCCF **10 Days before the Date of the Show

These entries will be disqualified. Remember, the effective date of all registrations and transfers is the **first date of valid receipt by the GCCF**.

Transfer of Exhibit from Exhibitor to a New Owner Received by the GCCF More Than **10 Days before the Date of the Show

Entries such as these will also be disqualified as the exhibitor's entry form becomes invalid.

Incorrect or Ineligibility of Class Entry

These will be disqualified from the class concerned – so always check with the Show Manager if in doubt about which class to enter.

If a breed number is changed officially, it is important that you notify the Show Manager immediately.

Exhibits entered in the Grand, Imperial Grand or Olympian class must have qualified on or before the published closing date of the show **which will include any extension published on the GCCF Website** (amended 21.10.2015) and the title must have been claimed in writing by that date. Exhibitors who enter Grand, Imperial Grand or Olympian classes without claiming the title will be reminded once, but if the title remains unclaimed the cat will be disqualified from this class at subsequent shows.

Cats Registered on the Reference Register

Most cats registered on this Reference Register (CSREF) are not eligible to be shown and, therefore, these entries could be disqualified. One exception to this is when a new breed becomes recognised, and then cats of the breed may be shown, even if they were originally registered on the Reference Register as long as this was the only reason for the Reference registration.

Exhibitors may appeal against any disqualification resulting from show checking, giving their reasons. The appeal will be referred to the GCCF Board if considered valid and, if not, a letter of explanation will be sent to the exhibitor(s). The above advice, however, is aimed at keeping your show entries trouble-free.

SHOW ENTRY

It is your responsibility to ensure that the correct details, taken from either the Registration or Transfer Form, are given for your exhibits, and that they are entered in the correct classes. Where an exhibit is jointly owned, either party may sign the declaration. Entries will not be accepted without the correct fees; or with post-dated cheques. Cheques should be made payable to Scottish Rex Cat Club. The Club will charge the exhibitor for any fees incurred from their bank due to cheques not being honoured. You are strongly recommended to send in a stamped address postcard or envelope for confirmation of receipt of your show entry and bring it with you on the day.

ONLINE ENTRY IS AVAILABLE FOR THIS SHOW.

Entries will also be accepted by email – scanned signed entry form please and payment by PayPal to scottishrexcatsclub@yahoo.co.uk (Friends and family) stating in the comments box Show Entry for... and your name, or by bank transfer: Sort Code 83-17-27, Account Number 00164150 also stating Show Entry and your name.

VETTING IN

Exhibits will be received at the entrance to vetting in from 8.15 am until 9.45 am, where vetting in slips will be given out. All exhibits must be presented to a veterinary surgeon for examination prior to going in the show hall for penning. **PLEASE HAVE THE EXHIBIT'S CURRENT VACCINATION CERTIFICATE READY TO SHOW THE VETERINARY SURGEON.**

Booster vaccinations against FIE, FVR and FCV must be given at the manufacturer's recommended intervals. Where a variable interval of 1-3 years is recommended for FCV and FHV, the minimum interval applies: i.e. all cats attending shows MUST receive an annual booster against FCV and FHV. For boosters only, note: Exhibitors are advised to leave at least a week between booster vaccination date and the show to allow the vaccine to take effect. Cats without valid certificates will be rejected under Section A. Cats unaccompanied by a vaccination certificate will also be rejected under Section A unless the exhibitor undertakes to provide proof of vaccination, valid for this show, by sending the certificate to GCCF office within seven days of the show. Failure to do so will lead to disqualification from this show and the cat's name will be placed on the Veterinary Rejection list until proof of vaccination is received in the Office.

HOMEOPATHIC vaccination is not acceptable for the purposes of showing.

All cats' claws must be clipped before entry to the hall is allowed.

THE GCCF RECOMMEND THAT ALL CATS AND KITTENS OWNED BY EXHIBITORS BE REGULARLY TESTED FOR FELV. CATS SHOWING A POSITIVE REACTION TO THE FELINE LEUKAEMIA VIRUS BLOOD TEST OR THE FELINE IMMUNODEFICIENCY VIRUS BLOOD TEST MUST NOT BE SHOWN.

Any exhibit rejected at vetting in, depending on the reason for rejection, may either be taken home, or placed in a quarantine pen away from the other exhibits. If, in the veterinary surgeon's opinion, it is desirable for any other exhibits from the same household, and/or the owners/agents to be debarred from the show, this will be enforced.

The Duty Veterinary Surgeon's decision is final.

PENNING OF EXHIBITS

Once admitted into the show hall, no exhibit may be removed without the permission of the Show Manager. Exhibitors must vacate the penned area of the hall on commencement of judging at 10.15 am, **having ensured that their exhibit and its pen conform to show rules**; and may not return, unless requested, until 12 pm.

Other than official notices or award cards, no written or printed matter may be placed on competitive pens. Exhibition pens only may be decorated and may carry printed matter relating to that exhibit.

The show is scheduled to close at 4 pm but MAY close earlier at the Show Manager's discretion. NO CAT MAY BE REMOVED FROM ITS PEN PRIOR TO THIS TIME, other than by judges, stewards, the Duty Vet or a SRCC Official. Exceptionally, the Show Manager may give permission for early removal from the show, if a prior written request has been received, or, if there are specific emergency circumstances on the day.

Details from your entry form will be processed by computer. Exhibitors' addresses will not be printed in the catalogue unless requested in writing to the Show Manager.

No entry may be withdrawn after the closing date.

Online closing date: 22nd July 2018

Postal entries: 20th July 2018 (postmark)

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

Breed Class	Open to all untitled cats, neuters or kittens of the specified breed.
Grand Class	A cat with the title of Champion/Premier must enter in this class and compete for a Grand Certificate.
Imperial Class	Cats with a Grand title must enter this class and compete for an Imperial Certificate.

Olympian Class	Cats with an Imperial title must enter this class and compete for and Olympian Certificate.
Cats/Adults	Not less than 9 calendar months on the day of the show.
Kittens	Not less than 14 weeks, and under 9 calendar months on day of the show. Neuter kittens will be entered in kitten Breed and Miscellaneous classes. Neuter kittens of Preliminary Breeds will be included in Kitten Assessment classes.
Neuter Adults	Neuter adults may only enter neuter classes and may not compete with entire cats or kittens except in Club classes, which are scheduled to include neuters.
Novice	Exhibits that have not won a 1st prize in any class at a show held under GCCF rules.
Limit	Exhibits that have not won more than four 1st prizes at a show held under GCCF rules.
Debutante	Exhibits that have never been shown at a show held under GCCF rules.
Breeders	Exhibits bred by exhibitor(s). Cats originally registered in the breeders' joint ownership but changed to single ownership can still be entered in this class. Cats originally registered in the breeder's single ownership and changed to joint ownership with a second breeder should be entered in the Non-Breeders class.
Junior	Cats over 9 calendar months of age and under 2 years on the day of the show.
Senior	Cats over 2 years and under 7 years on the day of the show.
Veteran	Cats 7 years and over on the day of the show.
Variant	For the purpose of this show, a Variant is a cat that is part Cornish/Devon/LaPerm/Selkirk Rex and has a straight coat.
Aristocats	Cats that have won one or more Challenge, Premier or Intermediate certificates.
Prefix Pair/ Family	Prefix Pair: any two cats with same prefix. Family: stud or queen plus one offspring (any age). Parent may be a neuter. Cats may be entered by one or two exhibitors. It must state clearly on the entry form who the other half of the pair is. If there is no room on the entry form then a separate note should be attached. If there are two exhibitors then the cats must be entered on both forms.
Housebuddies	Any two pedigree cats with one owner. Please indicate clearly on the entry form or by attached note which cats are paired.

The status of the exhibit for entering restricted classes (i.e. Maiden, Limit, etc) shall be the cat's status on the date of entry. The wins as a Kitten do not count when the exhibit is shown as an Adult or Neuter; the wins as an Adult do not count when the exhibit is neutered and shown. Merit Awards do not count as 'wins' for entering restricted classes.

Notes:

- (1) No cat shall be eligible to enter the Olympian, Imperial, or Grand classes, unless it has achieved the title of Imperial, Grand, Champion, or Premier, as appropriate, on or before the closing date for entries as published in the schedule for the show.
- (2) When counting wins/prizes, include all awarded in any class at a show held under GCCF rules.
- (3) Overseas titles: Cats with titles gained overseas are not eligible to enter Grand classes at GCCF licensed shows. Overseas titles may be included in brackets at the end of the cat's name in the show catalogue.

OTHER REGULATIONS

No entry will be accepted without the correct fee. No entry may be withdrawn after the closing date. Any cheque returned 'refer to drawer' and not honoured will be subject to a surcharge of £10.

If an exhibit cannot be shown due to illness, 50% of the entry fee may be refunded provided a Veterinary Certificate is received by the Show Manager not less than 14 days before the Show.

Exhibitors are liable for Veterinary or other costs occurred on their behalf during their absence from the show hall.

The Club Committee reserve the right to: cancel, split, amalgamate classes; refuse entry without giving reason; appoint other judges should appointed judges be unable to attend; appoint extra judges should numbers make this necessary; retain a percentage of the entry fees should the Show have to be cancelled for any reason.

An announcement on the GCCF website www.gccfcats.org of any alterations or additions made to the schedule shall be deemed sufficient notice. A notice will also be displayed in the show hall.

Queens who are pregnant, lactating or who have kitted within the past 12 weeks will not be exhibited.

Minimum age for entry is 14 weeks – **no kitten born after 28th April 2018 will be accepted.**

All correspondence should be accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope if a reply is expected. Any complaint about the show must be received in writing by the Show Manager within 7 days of the show.

Exhibitors should take great care not to use any stress remedy including Skullcap or Valerian or any shampoo or preparation that may in any way alter the colour or appearance of their cat as this will result in disqualification and may lead to disciplinary action.

Disinfectant handsprays. While there is no specific ruling against the use of handsprays at shows for disinfecting pens, the Executive Committee has emphasised that aerosols are not desirable and hand pump sprays should be used with discretion, particularly when there are cats in adjacent pens.

No exhibit may be removed before the end of the Show. Early removals will be not be permitted except in exceptional circumstances and by prior arrangement with the Show Manager. GCCF New Rule – Section 4, Rule 28. **The exhibitor will be reported to GCCF where disciplinary action will be taken resulting in a £50 fine and barred from showing until fine is paid for any exhibitor leaving, without permission of the Show Manager, before the show is officially closed.**

The use of small battery fans can be dangerous and could also be considered a distinguishing mark.

HOUSEHOLD PET SECTION

GCCF MASTER CLASSES AT CHAMPIONSHIP SHOWS FROM 1ST JUNE, 2011

Each cat can enter only one certificate class.

Exhibitors should check carefully which class is appropriate for their cat. All Adult Classes will be split if the opposite sex is entered.

THE COLOUR GROUP CLASSES: These are open to all untitled Neuters over nine months. Master Cat Certificates will be awarded to the winners. Titled cats may also be considered with the winners of these classes for Best of Colour/Best of Breed.

MASTER CLASSES: Cats with a Master title should enter in this class and compete for a Grand Master certificate OR they could be entered for Best of Colour/Best of Breed only, but not in competition in the above class.

GRAND MASTER CLASSES: Cats with a Grand Master title must enter this class and compete for an Imperial Grand Master Certificate OR they could be entered for Best of Colour/Best of Breed only, but not in competition in the above classes.
